

Using Views In Nagios Fusion 2024

Purpose

This document describes how to understand, configure, and use Views in Nagios Fusion.

Views Overview

Views are designed to provide individual users with quick access to Nagios Fusion pages and external websites they find useful. Views are often used by network administrators who wish to display important information on wall monitors in network operations centers (NOCs) or public locations.

Views are specific to individual Nagios Fusion users. Each user can create their own unique set of views to customize Nagios Fusion to fit their needs.

Accessing Views

In Nagios Fusion, select **Views** from the navigation bar.

The **Views** page will automatically rotate through each of the views the user has defined.

- In the left side menu under **My Views**, **Tactical Summary** is the view currently displayed.
- At the top of the left side menu, the rotation has **4** seconds remaining before the next view (**Recent Alerts**) is shown.

Using Views In Nagios Fusion 2024

View Rotation

By default, Nagios Fusion rotates through the views you have defined. This rotation can be stopped using either method:

- Clicking the **Pause Rotation** button - Changes to a **Resume Rotation** button
- Clicking the **Stop Rotation** link- Changes to a **Start Rotation** link

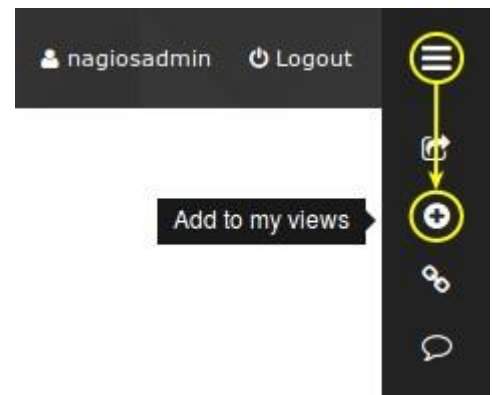
To adjust the rotation speed, use the slider at the top of the left side menu (next to the pause button), which ranges from 5 to 60 seconds.



Adding New Views

New views can easily be added from anywhere within Nagios Fusion. On the far right of the navigation bar there is an icon with three horizontal lines. When you hover over this icon a drop-down list of icons appears.

1. Click the **Add to my views (+)** icon to add the current page to your views.
2. A popup window will appear. Provide a **View Title**.

3. Click the **Add to Views** button to add the page to your views.
4. Navigate to the **Views** page and the page will be listed under **My Views**.

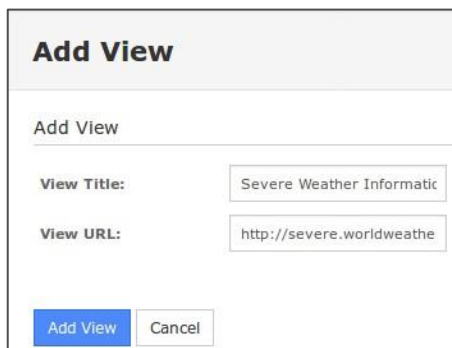

Adding External URL Views

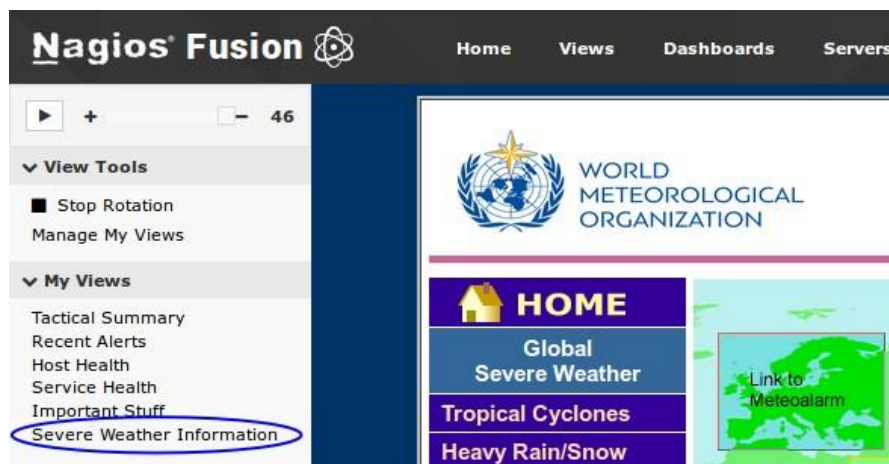
1. Navigate to **Views > View Tools > Manage My Views** and click the **Add a View** button. This allows you to provide links to external URLs which can help you with a "single pane of glass" NOC screen.



2. A pop up window will appear. Provide a **View Title** and a **View URL**.
3. Click the **Add View** button to add the view.



4. Navigate to the **Views** page and the new view will be listed under **My Views**.



Managing Views

Navigate to **Views > View Tools > Manage My Views** to reorder, edit, and remove views.

- Reorder the views by dragging and dropping them into the order that you desire.
- Click the **Edit** icon to change the **View Title** or **View URL**.
- Click the **Delete** icon to remove a view from the **My Views** list.
