Purpose

This document describes how to upload and install new dashlets in Nagios XI.

Components Overview


Components are optional extensions to Nagios XI that can be installed by administrators to provide enhanced functionality to both end-users and administrators alike. For example, components are available for providing new notification methods and UI enhancements and modifications.

Nagios XI components are distributed in ZIP files that can be easily uploaded and installed to Nagios XI. You do not have to open or modify the ZIP files, and you usually don't have to do any additional installation steps beyond uploading the ZIP file to Nagios XI.

Obtaining New Components



On the Nagios Exchange you will find components that have been released by external parties, as well as all the existing components that come included with Nagios XI. This guide will upload the History Tab component, which can be found on the Nagios Exchange. Simply download the historytab.zip file and you'll be shown how to upload it in the next step.


Component Installation

Installing a new component in Nagios XI is very simple.

1. Navigate to Admin > System Extensions > Manage Components.




2. Click the **Browse** button to select the new component you want to install.

- 3. Select the component file (.zip extension) that you previously downloaded using the window that appears and click **Open**.
- 4. Click the **Upload & Install** button to upload the component.



5. Once the component is uploaded, you will receive a message saying it was installed and it will appear in the list of components.



The **History Tab** component used in this example explains that it adds a tab to the host and service detail screens.


Note: Some components may require additional steps before they are fully installed and ready to be used. The component will display information indicating if you need to take additional installation steps.




Removing Components

To remove a component from Nagios XI, click the delete icon next to the component you wish to remove.



Note: Some components are required by Nagios XI and cannot be deleted.



You will receive an informational message once the component has been removed from Nagios XI.

Note: If you are developing a component for Nagios XI and the component produces errors which leaves Nagios XI inoperable, you will have to manually delete the component's directory in /usr/local/nagiosxi/html/includes/components/. Make sure to only remove the subdirectory associated with the problematic component!

Configuring Components

Some components may have additional configuration options available. To access these options, click the settings icon ext to the component.
